# Toronto Police Officer Sentenced to Suspended Sentence and Receives Weapons Prohibition for Off-Duty Assault on Brampton Teenager

**June 18, 2025**

Justice Jennifer Woollcombe (“Justice Woollcombe”) of the Ontario Superior Court of Justice has sentenced Constable Calvin Au, a member of the Toronto Police Service to suspended sentence and 12 months probation. On November 27, 2024, Constable Au was found guilty of his assault on Chadd Facey. Constable Au was also ordered not to possess any weapons, including a firearm, with no exception for employment given, for a period of three years. Constable Au will be required to provide his DNA as per Justice Woollcombe’s sentence.

Following the interaction with Constable Au, Chadd was transported to Brampton Civic Hospital by ambulance, where he died shortly after, in the late hours of April 26, 2021.

Fay Fagan, mother of Chadd Facey, commented on the sentencing decision saying:

“We appreciate Justice Woollcombe’s attention to this matter. However, there is no sentence that will ever bring Chadd back to us. We continue to live with the reality that he is not there and will never be there again. While this has been a long and difficult journey, we know that we are only beginning to obtain accountability for Chadd’s death.”

Renae Facey, sister of Chadd Facey:

“This trial has been a very trying and difficult time for me and my family. Sitting in court over the 6 days and listening to Constable Au testify in such an evasive and argumentative manner, caused us more pain. The guilty verdict and the sentence provides some level of accountability and I know that Constable Au still has to answer for PSA charges and the civil case that we have brought against him. I will continue to fight for my brother and have his voice be heard now that he cannot speak for himself anymore.”

Legal Counsel for Chadd’s family Asha James of Falconers LLP said:

“We appreciate the dedication and attention of Justice Woollcombe in this matter. Of course, the family believes that Constable Au should have received some jail time for his conduct, but the family respects the judge’s decision. We will continue to support Chadd’s family while they seek accountability from all parties who had a role in Chadd’s death.”

Constable Au still faces police disciplinary charges, and the family continues with their civil suit, seeking justice and accountability for Chadd.
